HIV Testing

There is currently no cure for HIV, so the sooner you know your status, the sooner you can begin to get treatment!

THE CDC RECOMMENDS TO GET TESTED IF:

- you are between the ages of 13 and 64 get tested for HIV at least once as part of routine health care
- you are a sexually active gay and bisexual male, more frequent testing is beneficial (every 3 to 6 months for example)
- you are sexually active and have never been tested
- have a sex partner who has had/is having sex with other people
- have used a needle previously used by another person
- have shared blood, semen, pre-seminal fluid, breast milk, vaginal fluid, or rectal mucous with another person in any other way
- you display flu-like symptoms, swollen glands, or a rash and fit in one of the above statements

HIV Self -Testing

With the home HIV test you can get tested in your own space at your own time!

- HIV tests cannot detect HIV immediately after infection
- A Rapid Self-Test produces results in 20 minutes
- The rapid self-test kit is available at a pharmacy or online
- A Mail-In Self-Test includes a specimen collection kit that contains supplies to collect dried blood from a fingerstick at home
- In both cases if your test result is positive, go to a health care provider for follow-up testing

HIV Prevention



Condoms are still one of the most cost-effective options to prevent HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases such as gonorrhea and chlamydia. Get your Condom Fact Sheet!

- PrEP is a prevention method used by people who are HIVnegative and at high risk for being exposed to HIV through sexual contact or injection drug use.
- If you have been exposed to HIV in the last 72 hours talk to your health care provider about post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP)
- PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) means taking medicine to prevent HIV after possible exposure
- PEP should be used only in emergency situations and must be take within 72 hours after possible exposure to HIV
- Start medical care and begin HIV treatment as soon as you are diagnosed with HIV
- Antiretroviral therapy (ART) is recommended for all people with HIV, no matter how long they've had the virus or how healthy they are
